Summer Reading Video Option Requirements
(a video can only be completed for one of your summer reading books)

Format:

The video is a minimum of 3 minutes long

The video is a maximum of 7 minutes long

The video is titled "Your Last Name Your First Name Summer Reading Video"

The video is shared with or emailed to your LA teacher by September 4th

The Basics:

The video includes the title of the book

The video includes the author and genre of the book

The video includes the name of the student

Content: *Demonstrate your knowledge and understanding of the book:*

Demonstrates Comprehensive Knowledge of the book through the following criteria:

Describes/Shows the book's setting, both time and place

Describes/Shows the book's main characters physically

Describes/Shows the book's main characters' personalities

Describes/Shows the central conflict/plot of the book

Describes/Shows how that conflict/plot affects the characters

Describes/Shows the theme of the book

Describes/Shows lessons learned by the characters

Describes/Shows your personal reaction to the book
